#### How long is an appointment?

Your first visit is usually 60 to 90 minutes. It may longer if you need lab tests. Follow-up visits are usually 30 to 60 minutes. The providers you see each visit depend on your needs.

After an initial consultation, we offer a thorough readiness assessment, which includes obtaining information from patients and their families. It takes six or eight hours and can be done in one day or divided over several sessions. If we determine that any mental health or other support is needed, we can connect patients with resources at Yale o in the community.

After the evaluation and when all agree that is safe, healthy, and appropriate, we offer a variety of care options related to gender affirmation. These <u>may include puberty-</u> blocking treatments, cross-hormone therapie and gender-affirming surgery (available only for patients aged 18 and older).

## What to Expect on Your First Visit and Beyond

Before you visit, please call to make an appointment and request **gender affirming** hormone therapy.

In most cases your clinician will be able to prescribe hormones the same day as your first visit. No letter from a mental health provider is required.

If you're starting gender affirming hormone therapy, you'll have an initial appointment with baseline lab work (blood draw) and then follow-up appointments. \*

#### Initial assessment

To assess where your child or youth is on their gender journ your family will meet with one of our assessors and Family Services Specialist at the Gender Clinic.

Appointments are scheduled for 90 minutes and families typically meet for a series of three separate appointments. During the 90 minutes, your provider will meet collectively with the family, and then will spend time individually with patient and parents/guardians.

You do not need to bring anything with you to your appointment. If we need to connect with current or past providers, we can arrange that during your appointment. A release of information for these providers will be required for youth (if 14+ years old) or parents to complete.

Based on what we learn, we will offer resources to best support your family in affirming your child or youth. This may include social and medical transition opportunities within the clinic, as well as additional resources within your community. Families have access to all of the CHOP Care Network primary care practices and specialty care centers.

### **PARENTAL RIGHTS 3-DAY NOTICE**

, as parent and/or legal guardian of

, a minor child, am hereby providing notice that if you become aware, directly or indirectly, that my child has requested to be known by different pronouns, by a different name or otherwise communicates or exhibits behaviors that communicates a desire to transition gender or sex, you should notify me within three (3) business days of having learned such information. Notification should be attempted by at least two (2) different methods of communications (e.g., phone call, text, email, mail). Without my prior written consent, under no circumstances shall my child be referred to or engage with any on-staff school counselor, contracted school counselor, social worker, or any mental health professional.
